Award Presentation to Fourth Place Journalism Winner

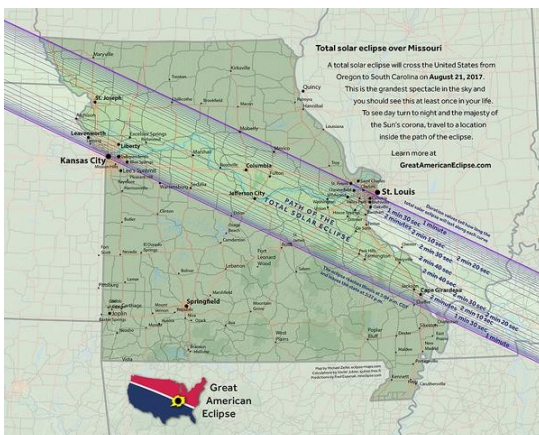

The University of Missouri Physics Department hosted the American Astronomical Society's 2nd workshop regarding the 2017 Eclipse in August. The main goal of the workshop was to start organizing professional and amateur astronomers to prepare the public for this special event. It was sponsored by the National Science Foundation.

Attendees from across the country, including the Astronomical League, participated in this event in Columbia, Missouri, which is one of the centerline locations for the eclipse. We encourage everyone to make plans to observe this very special event, somewhere close to centerline.

The Astronomical League's national convention, in 2017, is scheduled the week before the Monday, August 21, 2017 eclipse, in Casper, Wyoming, which is also on the center line.
